

RECYCLE OLD CELL PHONES

500 million used cell phones are lying around in this country. About 2 million are shelved or thrown in the trash every week.

Cell phones contain hazardous materials including cadmium, lead, mercury, nickel and gallium arsenide that can contaminate ground water when discarded in landfills. Recycled phones are kept out of landfills or incinerators, and are either refurbished and sold primarily in Latin America, or they are scrapped for parts. All makes and models of phones, pagers, PDAs and chargers are accepted, even if broken.
