









HANDY RULES FOR RECYCLING ITEMS MANDATED BY LAW

Recycling in Greenwich	What to Recycle	How to Recycle
<p>NEWSPAPER IN BLUE BIN -- Weekly Pick-up</p> 	<p>NEWSPAPERS - Include all sections of newspaper plus any coupon inserts and flyers that arrive inside. Only include what comes with your newspaper.</p>	<p>NEWSPAPERS - Bundled and tied with twine or in brown paper bags in blue bin. Do Not Include: Plastic bags or newspapers in the home-delivery sleeves, flyers, junk mail, wrapping papers, magazines, cardboard or catalogs.</p>
<p>COMMINGLED ITEMS IN BLUE BIN Weekly Pick-up (Bottles, Plastics & Cans)</p>  <p><i>Recycling 1 aluminum can saves enough energy to run your TV for 3 hours. Recycling one glass bottle or jar saves enough energy to light a 100-watt bulb for 4 hours. Recycling one ton of newspaper saves: 17 mature trees, 7,000 gallons of water, 380 gallons of oil, 587 pounds of air pollution and enough energy to heat a home for 6 months.</i></p>	<p>GLASS - Empty, unbroken bottles and jars: clear, brown and green glass food and beverage containers. Rinse and remove tops.</p> <p>PLASTIC - Empty juice, soda, water, milk, laundry soap, shampoo bottles and other plastic containers marked 1 and 2.</p> 	<p>GLASS - Rinse, leave labels on, discard caps and put in blue bin. Do Not Include: Drinking glasses, pyrex, mirrors, window or auto glass, light bulbs, ceramics, broken glass, tops and caps.</p> <p>PLASTIC - Rinse, leave labels on, discard caps, flatten large non-deposit items and put in blue bin. Do Not Include: Any plastic 3 thru 7.</p> 
<p>MIXED PAPER (Once-A-Month Pickup by a Trash Hauler, Paid for by the Town) 869-6910</p> 	<p>MIXED PAPER - Any color paper, including all computer or shredded paper, telephone books, catalogs, envelopes, magazines, greeting cards, non-metallic wrapping paper and glossy shopping bags. No Newspaper. Homeowner will provide a 24-gallon bin with lid to be placed near household garbage bins.</p>	<p>MIXED PAPER - Keep it loose, no bags - put in your mixed paper bin. Do Not Include: Newspapers, plastic bags, brown bags, food boxes or packaging, metal or plastic spiral bindings, tissues or paper towels, corrugated cardboard, hardcover books, overnight envelopes, plastic or plastic reinforced folders.</p>
<p>CORRUGATED and other CARDBOARD - Bring to Holly Hill Facility to Recycle. 869-6910</p> 	<p>CORRUGATED and Other CARDBOARD - Remove ALL Contents including: foam, peanuts, styrofoam, bubble wrap, plastic bags, broken merchandise. Include cereal/shoe/cracker boxes, boxes that tear grey or brown and brown bags.</p>	<p>CORRUGATED and Other CARDBOARD - Flatten boxes and remove extra tape. Take to Holly Hill Facility. Do Not Include: Wax cardboard, cardboard with excessive contamination (ink, dirt, etc) or plastic bags.</p>
