What is SOS?



SOS is a group of committed animal lovers organized under the aegis of the Bruce Museum. The committee plans to gather support to construct a new, up-to-code animal control facility. Familiarly known as the “dog pound,” although it handles animals of all kinds, the small cinderblock building sits next to the museum parking lot. Built in 1957, the antiquated structure has not met the minimum requirements for an animal shelter set by the State for some time. The animal control officers, and the more than 300 animals they rescue and shelter each year, endure primitive and potentially hazardous conditions. SOS has pledged to raise the funds to build a new municipal structure, located at another site to be provided by the Town. Naming opportunities will appeal to those interested in honoring or memorializing a cherished pet. We hope you will join us in supporting this compassionate effort.
