## Minutes of Meeting April 24, 2006 4:30 pm, Police Library

### NEW BUSINESS

- Captain Ridberg handed out monthly statistics for February and March, which were discussed briefly. Members decided these were useful, and I will continue to hand out.
- Capt. Ridberg asked the group if anyone was interested in doing school crossings.
- Capt. Ridberg will contact Highway Department about the potential for hazardous conditions at "The Pit" at West Putnam Avenue and Holly Hill should it continue to be left unattended.

### ONGOING ACTIVITIES

- 600 Teen Survey cards returned thus far. Results given to Parks & Recreation. Teen Center and United Way to address alternative options for teens. Prize drawing to be done.
- Extensive discussion of the Youth Initiative and next steps followed. It was decided that Capt. Ridberg would write a report describing the Youth Initiative Program and its results. The report would then be sent to the First Selectman and the United Way with a recommendation that Youth Services Coordinator Jennifer Byxbee take over the program. CAPP would maintain a liaison with the United Way.
- Capt. Ridberg continuing to try to find alternate location for tractor-trailer off-loading. Mr. Gomeau advised Grass Island has now been posted "Parking Only for Park Facilities."

### OLD BUSINESS

- No suspects in pellet gun vandalism in Byram and Pemberwick. Incidents have become more sporadic.
- Decrease in gang-like activity among group of problem teens in West Sector.
- Dave Rabin agreed to draft letter to Board of Education expressing CAPP's concerns over non-residents illegally attending Greenwich Public Schools.
- Gang Life talk given by Malaki Mapp at Boys & Girls Club was a success with over 180 in attendance.
