The collision analysis is interesting in a couple of respects. First, Greenwich Ave reported 12 collisions in November 2004 and we have seen a reduction in 2005. Greenwich Ave became a focus of the STEP initiative during the week of Thanksgiving and will continue to be through December. East Putnam Ave. for statistical purposes is classified as from Greenwich Ave. to the Stamford Town line but not including the area of the E. Putnam running through Cos Cob, which is classified in the GPD computer system as Post Rd. Combining E. Putnam Ave and Post Road reveals a significant amount of collision activity, which will continue to be addressed.

The speed trailers were deployed to North Water St., Steamboat Rd., S. Water St., and Greenwich Ave.

As previously stated the STEP initiative will continue to focus on the Central Business District (C.B.D.) for the Holiday season through the month of December. A pedestrian safety operation was conducted on Greenwich Ave. at Amogerone Crossway in which the warning flyers were passed out in lieu of citations. The goals of the CBD initiative are two-fold; to reduce the collision experience of Greenwich Ave., which is the highest in Town, and to attempt to alleviate the traffic congestion caused by traffic violators.
