Services Include:

- Assistance with Benefit and entitlement applications and redeterminations for: Medicaid, Social Security, subsidized housing, food, clothing, medications, and many kinds of special needs.

 - Activities of daily living: bill-paying, shopping services
 - Temporary emergency financial assistance
 - Escorted transportation by appointment
 - Budget and money management counseling

 - Parent/child/marital counseling and referral
