### **PUBLIC MEETING**

Chairman Tom Baptist called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall Meeting Room on the first floor of Greenwich Town Hall.

### **Agency Session**

#### **Seating of alternates**

It was the decision of Chairman Tom Baptist to seat Rob Sisca in the absence of Lawrence Perry, and Stephan Skoufalos in the absence of Matt Popp.

#### **Review and approval of draft minutes of February 23, 2009**

A motion to approve the draft minutes of February 23, 2009 without correction was made by Martin Kagan, second Bill Galvin. The motion carried 7-0.

#### **Director's Report**

March 2009 Summary Report -

During the month of February, the Agency received its first two applications for docks to be maintained on Mianus Pond. The applications were submitted by two of the seven member committee that volunteered to serve as a test group for the pond community. The Director believes extraordinary effort has been taken by all members of staff to communicate the regulatory process, and, therefore, believes the process was completed without any undue penalty or burden to the participating committee members. Unfortunately, initial communication breakdowns believed to be resolved have now resurfaced, despite approvals with standard provisions. Following the last monthly meeting of the Agency, the Director has

participated in a number of follow-up committee meetings and various communications, all in an effort to clarify set conditions established by the Agency. Although progress has been noted, it is feared that community gains are threatened by unreasonable demands. After discussing the issue with the Executive Committee, a decision has been made to require all applications for pond abutters to be made by October 2009. Those who fail to meet the deadline will be subject to the normal application process, which includes additional fees and any other required enforcement action for non-compliance. Agency members were addressed by Vin DeFina, neighborhood community member. Mr. DeFina stated that most pond owners were in agreement with the process laid out by the Agency. The Agency was also requested to make a few changes to conditions established in one of the previously approved applications. Mr. DeFina was thanked for his hard work, but reminded that the Agency had a regulatory duty to perform. Consequently, the Agency decided to keep the October deadline, and ruled that a Modification would be necessary to amend the permit condition in question.

Agency staff has been made aware of a proposed development community on King Street. The property appears to extend from the corner of King Street and Anderson Hill Road and sits largely within the municipal boundary of Rye Brook, NY. Because staff has been informed that stormwater would not be directed into Greenwich and that wetland systems within the Town would not be affected by development, the decision was earlier made to assign regulatory oversight to Village officials. Recently, Rye Brook officials have informed the Agency, amongst other Town Departments, of existing site features (specifically the installation of utilities and parking) that failed to secure Permit from the Town of Greenwich. The parking appears to have been established by a food vendor that has also utilized the property without the prior consent of the landowner. Inspection of the site finds wetlands proximate to the parking area, but without the benefit of a survey showing accurate boundaries and municipal borders, a determination cannot be made as to what municipality has regulatory authority over this issue. It is also the opinion of the Director that the assignment of responsibility to resolve this matter shall rest with officials within New York, since both the Village and land owner contend that the Town is not permitted to require any applications for the development of the larger “Kingswood” Community. Agency members that are approached by Greenwich residents about the development of this property should direct calls of concern to the Village of Rye Brook.

In recent months, the Agency has begun to experience a mild increase in applications for Permit. During the recent submission deadline period, Agency staff took in 17 projects for consideration, which is an increase for the third straight month. For unexplained reasons, the submission of applications in recent months is no longer indicative of the Green Sheets received for review. Green Sheet totals over the past 6 months have experienced a precipitous drop, despite relatively static monthly application totals during this same period. Members were informed that a total of 28 Green Sheets were received during the period between February 24 and March 19, 2009. Staff limited the submission of applications to just three sites, and signed off projects for six properties with identified wetland or watercourse areas.

#### Agent Approvals

The Agency was presented with Legal Notices for three Agent Approvals issued during the period following the last regularly scheduled meeting. No questions or comments were taken from Agency members.

#### Compliance Report

Doreen Carroll-Andrews referred to the Compliance Summary which included a breakdown of bond releases (15 requested, 18 initiated by Staff, 31 released), Stop Work Orders issued (2) and deadlines set by the Agency that are upcoming or have passed. Under Deadlines Passed, 28 Dairy Road was later discussed by Bob Clausi under Violations.

**Public Discussion Session**

**Town of Greenwich Projects**

**#2009-17 – River Road – Town of Greenwich DPW**

The Staff Report by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of a permit. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the Department of Public Works Division of Engineering was Frank Petise. Mr. Petise offered no objections to the Staff Report. A motion to approve was made by Martin Kagan, second John Conte. The motion carried 7-0.

**Pending Applications**

**#2009-08 – 221 Round Hill Road – Timothy O’Neill – Tax #10-1410**

The Staff report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of a permit with conditions. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the applicant were Atty. Tom Heagney of Heagney, Lennon & Slane, John Giancola, P.E. of Ahneman Kirby, LLC, and Bill Kenny of William Kenny Associates. Details of the site development plan were presented by Atty. Heagney, who offered no objections to staff comments. After short deliberation, a motion to approve the project without Special Condition 3 was made by Garrett Dietz, second Martin Kagan. The motion carried 7-0.

**#2009-09 - 24 & 30 Cat Rock Road – Francis Burgweger and Richard Kral – Tax #8A-1055, #8A-1243**

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of a permit. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the applicants was Brian Smith, P.E., Ahneman Kirby, LLC. Mr. Smith summarized the development project and assured Agency members that impacts to wetland and watercourse areas were not likely as a result of the activity. Mr. Smith stated he was in agreement with the staff recommendation. Hearing no objection, a motion to approve was made by Martin Kagan, second Bill Galvin. The motion carried 7-0. Elliot Benton left for the evening at 7:55 p.m.

**New Applications**

**#2009-11 – 7 Partridge Hollow Road – Ella Razmovskaya – Tax #10-3453 - *DELAYED***

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended Delay, pending the submission of outstanding information and materials. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of Ms. Razmovskaya was Atty. Melissa Klauberg of Ivey Barnum & O’Mara. Ms. Klauberg requested the Agency consider issuing a permit with conditions, as it was her belief the outstanding materials were easily obtained and, therefore, did not warrant further delay. Ms. Klauberg also noted that her client had been advised of the Wetland Regulations as well as her obligations as a parcel owner with wetlands and watercourse areas. Members were informed that the fence installation was a sincere oversight and that the land owner was looking to resolve the outstanding compliance matter. In the absence of conditions, a motion to Delay was made by Martin Kagan, second Stephan Skoufalos. The motion carried 7-0.

**#2009-12 – 65 Dandy Drive – Donna Kelly and John Bonito – Tax #8-1149**

The Staff Report prepared by Doreen Carroll-Andrews recommended the issuance of a permit for the removal of spoils within and adjacent to wetland areas. Appearing before the Agency was the property owner, Donna Kelly. Ms. Kelly summarized activities and requested the ability to alter the stream bed

profile. However, in the absence of a detailed drawing and related schematic, the Agency elected to remove issues associated with the stream bed improvements from consideration during the review of the current application. A motion to approve without the stream bed modification was made by Martin Kagan, second Bill Galvin. The motion carried 7-0.

#2009-13 – 69 Dandy Drive – Anne and Roger Bensen – Tax #8-1150

The Staff Report prepared by Doreen Carroll-Andrews recommended the issuance of a permit for the removal of spoils. Christie Coon, Certified Soil Scientist, of Wetland Resources, LLC, appeared before the Agency on behalf of the Bensens. Also in attendance was owner Anne Bensen. Ms. Coon informed the Agency that the regulated activities were conducted in ignorance, and that the Bensens were now aware of the Agency's Regulations and their responsibilities as a landowner with wetland and watercourse areas. No objection to the staff recommendations was heard by the applicant or concerned neighbors. A motion to approve was made by Martin Kagan, second Bill Galvin. The motion carried 7-0.

#2009-16 – 1 Glenville Street – One Glenville LLC – Tax #9-2203

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of a permit. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the applicant was Eric Brower, AICP. Also in attendance were Brendon Lacoff and Ron Young of One Glenville LLC. Mr. Brower advised the Agency that zoning constraints prevented the relocation of the building in a direction away from the adjacent watercourse. John Conte questioned whether the staff recommendations considered that the foundation may require removal and potentially create additional disturbance within the neighboring river. Martin Kagan noted that the applicant had failed to include 5 Glenville Street as a property in which regulated activities would occur. It was decided that future actions should note the legal correction. After lengthy debate, the Agency concluded that the application could go forward with the understanding that the Agency would be required to review the final construction drawing as a modification. At such time, work associated with the foundation would be closely scrutinized for its potential effect on wetland and watercourse areas. It was also decided that the suggested bond amount should be raised to \$20,000. A motion to accept the staff recommendation with the added conditions was made by Martin Kagan, second Bill Galvin. The motion carried 7-0.

#2009-20 – 59 Rockwood Lane – Richard Santarosa and Donna Hagberg – Tax #11-1576

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of a permit. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the applicant was Doug DiVesta, P.E. of DiVesta Engineering. Mr. DiVesta offered no objections to the staff recommendation. A motion to approve was made by Martin Kagan, second Garrett Dietz. The motion carried 7-0.

#2009-21 – 7 Wyckham Hill Lane – Arthur Hershaft – Tax #11-3106

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of a permit. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the applicant was Larry Liebman of S.E. Minor & Co. Mr. Liebman offered no objections to the staff recommendation. A motion to approve was made by Martin Kagan, second Bill Galvin. The motion carried 7-0.

#2009-22 – 21 Scott Road – Joseph and Mary Huley – Tax #11-1435 – **POSTPONED**

At the request of the applicant, the matter was postponed to allow for additional time to consider staff comments. No Agency action was required.

#2009-23 – 107 Doubling Road – Thomas N. Keltner, Jr., Trustee - Tax #11-2005

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of a permit. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the applicant was Tony D’Andrea, P.E. of Rocco V. D’Andrea, Inc. Mr. D’Andrea apologized for work commencing without the prior consent of the Agency. It was also the request of Mr. D’Andrea that the additional fee be waived. Agency Director Michael Chambers stated the additional fee was required for staff hours spent resolving the lack of site compliance. After short deliberation, it was determined that the Notice of Violation should remain on the Land Records, and that the deadline for the installation of the drainage system should be reduced to a period no later than October 31, 2009. A motion to accept the staff recommendation with added conditions was made by Martin Kagan, second Rob Sisca. The motion carried 6-0. Tom Baptist was out of the room. Garrett Dietz was seated as Chair.

#2009-28 – 27 Rustic View Road – Galdino Jose Claro – Tax #8A-1194

The Staff Report prepared by Michael Chambers recommended the issuance of a permit to maintain a garden enclosure. Appearing before the Agency was Mr. Claro. Mr. Claro offered no objections to the staff recommendation and apologized for commencing the activity without the prior consent of the Agency. Also providing comment to the Agency was neighbor, Ms. Barbara Sinko, while written comment was provided by Mr. Gordon McKenzie, Jr. of 169 Stanwich Road. Ms. Sinko informed the Agency that the garden was likely to have an impact on adjacent wetland and watercourse areas and, therefore, should be removed to a more appropriate location of the property. John Conte noted that erosion channels were likely to form due to the wood planks included in the enclosure’s construction and, therefore, requested the installation of buffer plantings around the structure. Members also moved to shift the enclosure an additional 4 feet from the property line. After careful deliberation, a motion to approve was made by John Conte, second Stephan Skoufalos. The motion carried 7-0.

***New Modifications***

#2002-78 – 120 Perkins Road – Burning Tree Country Club – Tax #11-2504

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of the Permit Modification request. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the Club were representatives Chris Romano, Construction Manager with Saugatuck Construction; Roger Bacon, Burning Tree Country Club General Manager; and Bill Kenny of William Kenny Associates. Mr. Romano advised the Agency that the Club was in agreement with the added conditions. Tom Baptist questioned whether wetlands up gradient of the stone arch repair would be adversely affected by the channel improvement. Bill Kenny stated that the issue had not been closely analyzed; however, it was his professional opinion that it would not be a concern. Martin Kagan also questioned whether the drainage change would have an effect on the overall course drainage improvement plan. Both Bill Kenny and Michael Chambers stated that the concern was not likely. Hearing no additional concerns, a motion to approve was made by Martin Kagan, second Garrett Dietz. The motion carried 7-0.

#2004-96 – 120 Tomac Avenue – Innis Arden Golf Club – Tax #6-1674

The Staff Report prepared by Michael Chambers recommended the issuance of a permit for the channel improvement. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the permittee was Tony D’Andrea, P.E. of Rocco V. D’Andrea, Inc. Mr. D’Andrea summarized the course improvements and stated that the activity was likely to improve existing wetland areas adjacent to the 8<sup>th</sup> tee box. During the course of the Agency deliberation, a number of alternatives were considered; however, a motion to approve as presented was made by Martin Kagan, second John Conte. The motion carried 7-0.

2004-110 – 918 North Street – Robert E. Crabtree – Tax #11-2441

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended the issuance of a permit for an in-ground pool. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the permittee was Jim McTigue of Risoli Planning & Engineering. Mr. McTigue offered no objections to the staff recommendation. A motion to approve was made by Martin Kagan, second John Conte. The motion carried 7-0. *Rob Sisca recused for professional conflict. Stephan Skoufalos was seated.*

#2001-187 – 3 Carriage Road – Edward and Margaret Martino – Tax #8-3478 - DELAYED

The Staff Report prepared by Bob Clausi recommended Delay, pending the submission of a complete application. Property owner Edward Martino was present to respond to staff comments and present details of the fill removal. Mr. Martino objected to the need to involve professionals in an attempt to resolve site violations. Agency members informed the permittee that the process was necessary and likely to improve the time required to cure the violation. A motion to Delay was made by John Conte, second Matt Popp. The motion carried 7-0.

**Violations**

Application #2006-123 – 28 Dairy Road - Ronnie Shemesh

The Violation Summary was provided by Robert Clausi. The Summary noted the history of activities on site which ultimately led to the removal of vegetation established within and adjacent to wetland areas. Appearing before the Agency on behalf of the land owner was Matthew Petrizzi of Petrizzi Bros. Landscaping. Mr. Petrizzi advised members of the Agency that the property owner was willing to comply and had instructed him to prepare a plan that was deemed satisfactory by staff and members of the Agency. In the absence of an acceptable site plan, the Agency elected to delay consideration of the violation matter, however, decided that an application was not necessary to resolve the violation. Activities conducted on site will be done as a compliance matter associated with the active permit assigned to Application #2006-123.

### **IWWA Officer Nominating Committee**

**As a result of the decision by IWWA Chairman Tom Baptist not to seek another term, Chairman Baptist appointed an Officer Nominating Committee (the “Committee”) comprised of Garrett Dietz, Stephan Skoufalos, and Bill Galvin to develop a slate of candidates for the offices of Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the IWWA.**

**In the process of developing this slate of candidates, the Committee interviewed all Agency members, including Chairman Baptist, and alternates, as well as IWWA Director, Michael Chambers. The basis for each of these confidential interviews was an interview guide (copy attached).**

**In addition to a proposed slate of candidates, the interview process produced a consensus view of the key attributes necessary for success in each position as well as several insights to enhance the future of effectiveness and efficiency of the Agency.**

### **ROLE ATTRIBUTES**

**Chairman**

- Possess a broad understanding of the legal, regulatory and environmental issues
- Fully represent Agency and communicate effectively with all stakeholders – (public, town officials, professionals practicing in the field, staff, etc.)
- Effectively advocate for and manage the Agency’s policies regarding permits, meetings and other related processes
- Attract, engage and retain strong agency members and fully leverage their skills, experience and contributions
- Evidence a fair-minded and objective demeanor with a true belief in the positive benefits of collaboration and dialogue
- Objectively and respectfully solicit opinions of parties affected
- Manage meetings effectively; moderate debate without characterizing testimony
- Be available to provide counsel and administrative support to the Director

**Vice Chairman**

- Be capable of serving as Chairman
- Ideally, provide skills which complement those of the Chairman

**Secretary**

- Exhibit strong attention to detail
- Be competent in reviewing permits
- Be a good parliamentarian, well versed in Roberts Rules of order
- Be capable and informed enough to raise questions about procedure

**INSIGHTS ON ENHANCING AGENCY EFFECTIVENESS AND EFFICIENCY**

**Communications**

- Expand IWWA communications and out-reach programs to the public
- Ensure critical Agency issues are shared with all Agency members
- Explore use of overhead projectors / Power Point to better serve public
- Engage / educate all land-use professionals to improve application process
- Proactively address the IWWA budget in the contest of the town’s fiscal imperatives

**Process**

- Improve the consistence of format and level of detail in staff reports
- Encourage use of ‘best practices’ in all application approvals
- Improve process of time allocated to public comment on applications
- Research methods to reduce cost of application process (applicants now pay for attorneys, surveyors, engineers, landscape design)
- More time for agency members to review applications/interact with staff regarding reports
