Dear Resident,

Due to the parking limitations in specific town residential areas, the Town of Greenwich have identified designated restricted locations for residential parking permits, which allows parking on street during parking restrictions with a parking decal. A six month trial (pilot) period has been approved for this residential parking decal for designated residents who reside in the designated neighborhoods. The areas participating in this program are:

Greenwich:

• Bruce Park Avenue **	11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.	Zone 1
• Ridge Street	11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.	Zone 2
• Havemeyer Place	11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.	Zone 2
• Lincoln Avenue	11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.	Zone 3
• Lexington Avenue	11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.	Zone 3
• Widgeon Way	7:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m.	Zone 10
• Maher Avenue	7:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m.	Zone 10
• Lenox Drive	11:00 a.m. - 2:00 a.m.	Zone 10
• Washington Avenue	11:00 a.m. - 2:00 a.m.	Zone 10

** Bruce Park Avenue parking restriction was changed from 2:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. to 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

If you live in one of these areas or in the Greenwich Central Business District and want to qualify for a parking decal, you must complete a Residential Parking Permit Application for consideration by the Director of Parking Services and provide a copy of your motor vehicle registration card.

The residential parking decal will be assigned to an owner or user of a vehicle, who meets the specified qualifications. This will allow a vehicle to park in the designated residential area during the posted restricted time period (11AM – 2PM) and (7:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m.). The decal should be placed on the rear window on the drivers side in the lower corner.

Acceptable proof of residency will be a current registration certificate issued by the Connecticut Registry of Motor Vehicles, utility bill or telephone bill. Two visitor permits per household, if approved can also be issued for use by visitors only, while visitors are actually visiting the household to which they were issued. The visitor permits are to be displayed on the front dashboard and must be fully readable from the exterior of the vehicle. Any extended use of a visitor permit must have prior approval by the Department of Parking Services. Visitor permits should be returned to the resident at the conclusion of the visit, as they will not be replaced if lost.

The residential parking decal and visitor permits can be requested from the Parking Services Office, behind the Greenwich Town Hall at 101 Field Point Road. There will be no permit fee during the six month pilot period. If approved after the six month period there will be an administrative and processing fee.
